



Renovation Underway

On a brisk December 12, 2022, the groundbreaking ceremony took place at 11:00 a.m. for the new Jeffrey-Glidewell Club. The \$3.1 million dollar construction project will provide a much-needed renovation to the facility. The Jeffrey unit has been in its current location since 1978. The project will provide a state-of-the-art instructional and STEAM program rooms. It will also consist of 3,600 sq foot of new learning space, music, dance, innovation technology and administrative offices. Located behind the renovated building two Futsal courts will be added. Futsal is a smaller, sided soccer court that will be used for multi-purposes such as pickleball and basketball courts. The renovation will take approximately 13 months to complete. When reopened, the club will officially be named the Jeffrey-Glidewell unit after Jerry Glidewell, the former Executive Director who recently retired after 43 years of service to the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club. Under his direction, renovations have taken place at all four club facilities and Hunts Park.

Jim Harwood Retires From FSBGC Board

Jim Harwood joined the Fort Smith Boys Club in 1948. He often caught the city bus down Sixth Street to the Club at 215 Wheeler Avenue. He played on teams at Lions Club Park at an early age and Hunts Park through American Legion baseball where his 1955 team coached by Ace Parker won the state championship. Harwood started for the Grizzly high school football team and then joined the Arkansas Tech University Wonder Boys baseball team as the leadoff hitter and starting centerfielder. At Tech, he met and married Linda Beth Gant and graduated with a degree in Accounting. Jim received his commission from the ROTC program and served on active duty with the U.S. Army for the next two years.

Making Fort Smith their home, the young couple raised two children, Kristen and Kyle. Jim was employed by the City National Bank. Linda taught English at Fort Smith Southside High School. Jim continued to support and be active with the FSBGC. In 1973, Jim joined the Board of Directors of the Club, served on numerous committees and as president of the Board.

Jim Harwood rose to the position of president of the City National Bank which became a part of the BancorpSouth system. Harwood was appointed by the state governor as an Arkansas Tech University Trustee. In 2000, he was inducted into the FSBGC Hall of Fame.

In 2022, Harwood retired from the FSBGC Board of Directors after fifty years of service. Jim Harwood is a family man and represents with his heart, his passion, and his actions an amazing dedication to the well-being of our community, its youth, and our organization.

Dr. Marta Loyd, retired in April 2022 as executive director and CEO of the Winthrop Rockefeller Institute on Petit Jean Mountain, a position she held since 2014. Prior to joining the Institute, she served 12 years as vice chancellor for advancement at the University of Arkansas Fort Smith and as executive director of the UAFS Foundation. Recently, Marta accepted a new role as executive coach and chair of three executive peer advisory boards for Vistage Worldwide.

Marta, a Fort Smith native, now lives at Lake Ouachita with Greg, her husband of 40 years. They have three children and six grandchildren. "I worked as a front desk clerk at Evans Boys Club during the summer when I was 15 years old. I developed a heart for the mission, the kids, and the leaders who invested in them. It is a distinct honor to join the board for an organization I admire and in the community I love."

AT&T Foundation Powering the FSBGC Into the Future

The technology labs in The Fort Smith Boys and Girls Club's four locations (Units) play a vital role in providing broadband and computer access for the boys and girls in the Fort Smith community. In each unit, we have dedicated technology labs for the children to utilize during the after-school and summer programming. Many of our children have no or limited access to broadband access or computer technology in their homes, and this makes it very challenging to complete homework or digital learning. With the assistance of the AT&T Foundation, we would be able to provide a more robust, dedicated, digital educational program on a consistent daily basis in our units. In addition to the technology labs we have, The Boys & Girls Club of America (BGCA) provides web-based educational opportunities such as My Future (virtual vocational program), Power Hour (homework assistance programming), and Summer Brain Gain (educational programming that addresses summer learning loss). With the assistance of the AT&T Foundation, we would be able to hire three part-time staff that would work with the children in the technology labs during the after-school and summer program in 2023, this would increase access for these children to have technology and educational programming. The biggest challenge besides the actual technology and internet costs is having funding to hire properly trained and educated staff to manage the digital educational programs in the units. This grant opportunity would ensure we have adequate, properly trained staff to supervise and assist the children with these great programs and help give children additional time and opportunities in the labs.

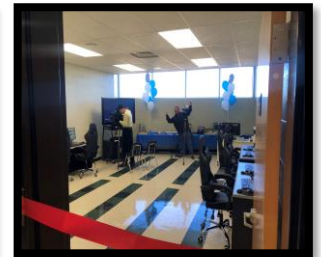

The Cox Innovation Lab was welcomed with a grand opening ceremony held by the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Clubs on November 17, 2022. The donation is part of a greater \$150,000 gift from The James M. Cox Foundation to create five new Cox Innovation Labs across the nation, develop STEAM programming and provide training for the Boys & Girls Club staff. The Innovation Labs are the cornerstone of the Boys & Girls Clubs of America Club Tech program, which provide students access to curriculum to advance their computer literacy skills. These Innovation Labs also help bridge the digital divide for children without access to a computer or internet connection at home.

“The Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club appreciates the continued support of Cox. The Cox Innovation Lab provides new and innovative technology and support to help bridge the digital divide that exists for many young people in Fort Smith,” said Beth Presley, CEO of the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club. “It will give the children going to the Boys & Girls Club the freedom to explore their interest in STEAM while providing those without a computer or internet access a way to get connected and manage through distance learning. It includes laptop computers, furniture, 3D printer, eSport, Wi-Fi and internet services provided by Cox.”

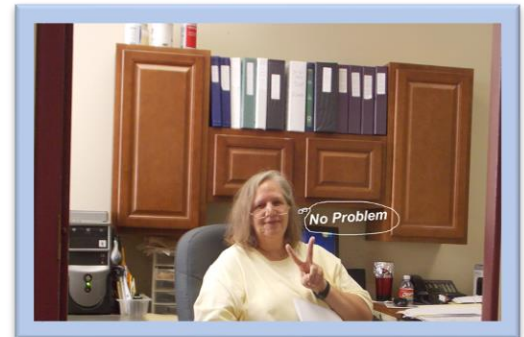
Helene Lewis Retires From the FSBGC

After more than 21 years with the club, Helene Lewis has decided to hang up her proverbial Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club hats. She wore so many for the FSBGC in her time that it probably took a while to find a hat rack big enough. Beginning in 2001, she was hired as Jerry Glidewell's office manager. Little did she know at the time, what that would entail.

"Jerry is constantly on the move and my job did too," Lewis stated. "I was the secretary, but I had to also write manuals, handle the human resources department, payroll, accounting, contracts, board of directors information, alumni, help with grants...I did everything an office needs...I even was the Secret Santa."

Before joining the clubs, Ms. Lewis attended high school in Huntsville, Arkansas. She enjoyed being a seamstress and made her own clothes. In 1975 she joined the United States Air Force as an accountant and left a sergeant in 1980. Ms. Lewis then headed to Westark (now UAFS) in Fort Smith where she went to school for program writing. She headed a one-person office at New Prospect Drilling for nine years before returning to program writing at Westark. After a couple of different accounting jobs, she returned to New Prospect Drilling for another seven years before joining the club and Mr. Glidewell.

"It has been an honor working for Jerry and the FSBGC. He was steadfast supporter of our community, the kids and his employees," Lewis said. "I think Ms. Presley will continue that work and do a wonderful job."

Joe was third in the NBA with a 44.9 three-point percentage on March 2, 2023 and led all OKC in scoring with 28 points against the Phoenix Suns on Feb. 24, doing the same with 24 points against the Sacramento Kings two days later. Williams is coming off a match up against the LA Lakers on March 1 where he had a game-high 12 rebounds and as of March 10 was first in the NBA with 27 charges drawn, something he also excelled at while a member of the Arkansas Razorback.

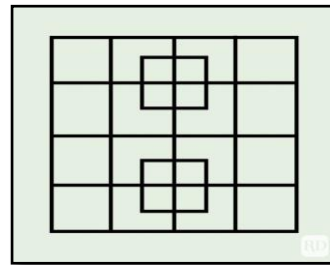
