



Scholarship Luncheon Awards \$50,000

The Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club honored its 2023-2024 scholarship recipients on Monday, June 12, 2023, at a celebratory luncheon. There were 34 recipients this year, including 13 new recipients and 21 renewal recipients, whose awards total \$50,000. Since 1985, the FSBGC College Scholarship Program has granted 947 awards to 387 individual club members, totaling over \$1 million in assistance. The scholarship program is one of the largest of any Boys & Girls Club organization in the country.

“Our scholarship program has grown immensely since the first scholarships awarded. Thanks to the support of our dedicated donors and the hard work of our members, we look forward to growing the program to serve even more club kids in the years to come,” shared Beth Presley, CEO of the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Clubs.

This year’s recipients will attend institutions across the nation, from the University of Arkansas-Fort Smith to John Hopkins University, and will major in a breadth of fields including Dental Hygiene, Business, Elementary Education, Engineering, and Neuroscience. Students who will be continuing their education locally will see 100 percent of their FSBGC scholarships matched through the UAFS Foundation. The university’s new match initiative was launched this year demonstrating the institution’s commitment to support the civic organizations that drive the River Valley forward.

Blake Rickman, vice chancellor of advancement at UAFS, said, “These scholarships are game changers. They open a world of opportunity for students who might not otherwise have been able to access higher education, and who will go on to be major players in our regional economy.”

Rickman is a Fort Smith native and a former Boys & Girls Club member and scholarship recipient. “It’s incredibly rewarding to see these young people taking their first steps into their future careers, and it is so energizing to know that the ten students in this group who will be attending UAFS are the future leaders of our community.”

JT Thorne has been a member of the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Clubs’ Jeffrey Unit since he was five-years-old. He now works at the Evans Unit while he earns his degree in Business Administration from Henderson State. “As a member and employee, I feel like this is the Boys & Girls Club investing in me to create my own future. This is them believing in me.”

Janice Powell Remembered

Janice Hobbs Powell of Fort Smith, Arkansas departed this life peacefully in her home on May 20, 2023 surrounded by family. A beloved wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and friend, Janice was also a civic leader, serving on several boards including the University of Arkansas Fort Smith Foundation, Sparks Regional Medical Center Board of Trustees, Fort Smith Public Schools Foundation serving as Director, and the Fort Smith Boys and Girls Clubs, where she served as the organization's first female President.

After joining the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club board of directors in 1999, Janice Powell remained a strong advocate for young people in our community.

Powell was FSBGC board president in 2010-2011 and served for many years on the Boys & Girls Club college scholarship committee. She and her husband Bob established the Janice H. and Robert M. Powell scholarship at the Club in 2017.

A native of Fort Smith, Powell attended the University of Tulsa. She worked as general partner of Hobbs & Curry. Established in 1928, the FSBGC never had a female board member until 1999, when Jane Morgan, Linda Schmidt and Janice Powell were added. She and her family have been generous contributors to the Evans, Hunts Park and Jeffrey renovation projects along with various other projects at the Club.

“Joining the Boys & Girls Club is a tremendous honor,” Burchett said. “The organization’s long legacy has touched many lives and accomplished amazing feats. I look forward to continuing in the footsteps of my predecessors and working with an amazing team to enrich the lives of young leaders in our community.”

Burchett earned a degree in anthropology from the University of Texas at Austin. She comes to the organization after serving as the Communication Director for St. Scholastica Monastery. Additional nonprofit positions include Development Director for HOPE Campus and counselor for the Settlement Home for Children, a nonprofit in Austin dedicated to the therapy of abused and neglected girls. Since moving to Arkansas, Burchett has served on numerous nonprofit boards and wrote the book “Dear Fort Smith” that chronicled lives of Fort Smith residents during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“If you want to look into the future of any community, all you have to do is look into the eyes of a child. My goal working with the talented team at the Fort Smith Boys & Girls Club is to make our children’s eyes shine with the best of what their futures hold,” Burchett stated.

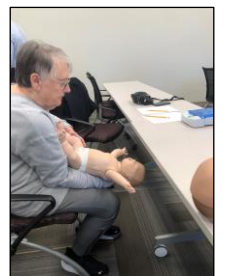
Programs that Ms. Burchett is currently working to develop include the STEAM program, Chess Club, Social Media Safety, Gardening and Mental Health program.

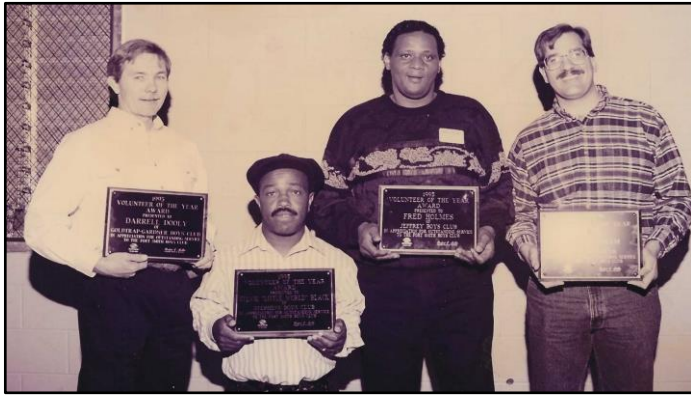

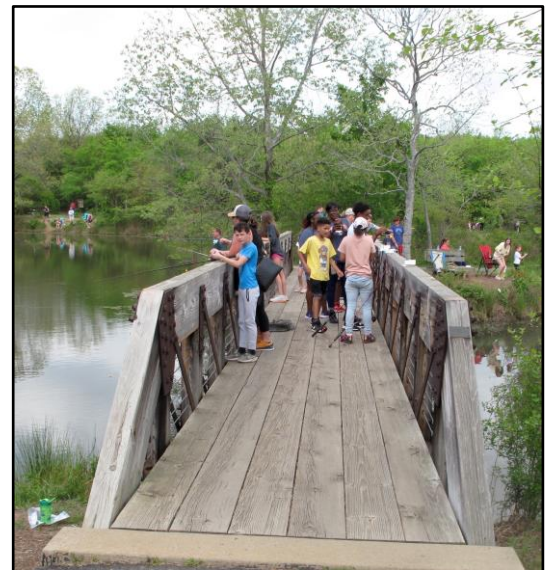




Family Fishing Derby
